A Special Lecture was organised on awareness on "Anti Ragging". Mrs Geetha, Inspector of Police and Mrs Ravipriya, Head Constable of Police Addressed the II B.E, II B.Voc, Physical education and Education Students. The following information were highlighted

- Supreme Court of India has laid down very strict rules for implementation of Anti Ragging measures to avoid occurrence of undesirable activities such as ragging inside or outside the campus.
- Ragging ordinarily means an act conducted or practiced by which power or status of senior students is brought to bear upon students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior by other students.
- Punishment for ragging is suspension from college and further the ward cannot continue their education in any institution.

She also added that in USA, 60% of IT graduates are preferred from India out of which 10% are women because in India, Education with self discipline and social responsibility is imparted which carries more value.
